THREE HOUR/HALF-DAY WORKSHOP

LEFTOVERS AGAIN? WHAT TO DO WITH LEFTOVER HANDWOVEN FABRIC



Explore and experience creative ways to use every precious bit of hand-woven scraps. Some require sewing, some a hot glue gun. Some ideas become great garments, some can be sent through the mail! Lots of ideas and lots of handouts. Learn piping, piecing, and appliqué techniques! Take home a

stitched post card to mail to your friends.



Students can expect to leave the class with many ideas and techniques for innovative ways of using scrap hand-woven fabric. This is not a class on patchwork! My goal is to have students gain the confidence to look at leftovers or scraps as a new and exciting raw material. A small hands-on project will conclude the workshop. Students will make a post card from hand-woven scraps and a photo or quotation.

ALL LEVELS ARE WELCOME

Daryl Lancaster, a hand-weaver and fiber artist known for her hand-woven, pieced garments, has been sewing for more than 40 years. She gives lectures and workshops to guilds, conferences, and craft centers all over the United States and is the Contributing Features Editor for Handwoven Magazine.

SUPPLY LISTS:

- a. Each student will need a chair grouped around a demonstration table. An extra table would be helpful for samples, story boards, etc. A garment rack for hanging samples would be helpful. For the hands-on project I will need a sewing machine with a new needle and white thread, two irons and ironing boards and 2 or 3 outlets and hot glue guns. I CAN PROVIDE THE SEWING MACHINE IF I AM NOT FLYING. Please note that all these items require electrical outlets so a supply of extension cords and power strips are necessary. Also, each student will need a workspace.

Also, I will be giving a Power Point Presentation for the first part of the workshop. I will need a screen. I will provide the laptop and projector.

- b. Students should bring:

- NOTEBOOK AND PEN (a highlighter also helps)
- SCISSORS
- A SMALL PHOTO OR QUOTATION NOT TO EXCEED 2" X 3"
- INTERESTING SEQUINS OR OTHER FLAT BANGLES OR CONFETTI OR LACE TRIMS FOR DECORATING POSTCARD
- SMALL SCRAP OF HANDWOVEN FABRIC (I WILL BE BRINGING LOTS OF SCRAPS TO USE SO FEEL FREE TO USE SOMETHING OF MINE.
- IF YOU MAKE HANDMADE PAPER, A 4x6" PIECE CAN BE USED FOR THE BACKGROUND

- c. I will be demonstrating the techniques with a Power Point Presentation and through the use of story boards and samples. In addition, I provide an extensive handout with detailed illustrations for making all the discussed techniques. For the hands-on project I will provide the postcard stock, fusing agent, hand-woven scraps, background material, and acetate cover.
